Federation & Leadership



General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC)

Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Reauthorization: One of the most significant legislative victories supported by GFWC was the reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA). GFWC members across the nation participated in advocacy efforts urging Congress to renew protections and services for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking. GFWC publicly celebrated the reauthorization and continues to advocate for increased funding for these programs.



What's New at CFWC

CFWC has released updated 2026 governing and program resources. The Federation's resource library now includes the **CFWC Bylaws & Standing Rules adopted at the May 2026 Convention**, **2026 CFWC Resolutions**, the **2026 Convention Awards Booklet**, and other updated Federation materials. These are useful because the resolutions tell clubs what issues CFWC has formally taken positions on.

Child online safety remains a prominent advocacy issue. CFWC is currently displaying GFWC's call to support the bipartisan **Kids Online Safety Act (KOSA)** and encouraging California Clubwomen to use the GFWC Legislative Action Center to contact Congress. The Federation describes the effort as seeking greater accountability and safeguards for children using social-media platforms.

The next major Federation event is approaching. The **GFWC Western States Region Conference** is scheduled for **September 11-13, 2026, in Park City, Utah**. After that, California's **Area Conferences begin in October**, with **Area D scheduled for October 24**. That **October 24** date is particularly relevant to Elsinore Woman's Club because De Anza District is part of Area D.

Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Reauthorization

Time to Honor WWII Cadet Nurse Corps: Answering the call to action from Phyllis Wilson, GFWC 2026-2028 Honorary Chairman, President of the Military Women's Memorial, and keynote speaker at the GFWC 2026 Annual Convention, the GFWC Legislative Action Center issued an alert urging Congress to enact the U.S. Cadet Nurse Service Recognition Act. The bill provides honorary veterans' status, honorable discharges, a service medal, a burial plaque or grave marker, and other commendations to the more than 124,000 women who answered the call to service during WWII. If you have not acted.

Alzheimer's Provider Training Bill Moves Forward: On July 20, the House of Representatives unanimously approved the Accelerating Access to Dementia and Alzheimer's Provider Training Act, authorizing funding for virtual dementia education and training to address the knowledge gaps and help build the workforce capacity needed to serve an increased number of patients with these unique health care challenges. Many thanks to GFWC members who responded to the Legislative Action Center alert supporting this bill. Now to the Senate!

Child Sexual Exploitation: Negotiations are continuing between Senate Commerce Committee leadership and the White House regarding the Kids Online Safety Act (KOSA, S. 1748) supported by GFWC and demands from technology companies for federal preemption of state restrictions and AI safety proposals. A July 29 markup has been postponed; action the week of August 3 is hopeful. If you have not acted on the GFWC Legislative Alert yet.



These legislative successes reflect years of advocacy by Clubwomen who wrote letters, responded to action alerts, attended District and State meetings, and ensured that our collective concerns were brought before lawmakers at both the state and national levels, including **Washington, D.C.**

SUPPLY LIST

Fabric: Fabric will be available but if you have a favorite from your own collection feel free to bring it.

Thread: A neutral-colored, lightweight 50wt or 60wt cotton thread

Fabric Glue Pen or glue stick

Fabric Scissors

Add-a-Quarter Ruler: This specialty quilting ruler features a handy lip that hooks onto the folded paper, allowing you to quickly and precisely trim your seam allowances.

Rotary Cutter (recommend 45mm) & small cutting mat

Sewing Machine: A standard machine capable of a straight stitch. A craft foot and/or 1/4" foot is recommended but most feet will work.

Iron & Mat (optional): An iron, travel iron, or wooden seam roller to press pieces flat. We will provide a few irons and ironing boards.

If you would like to add your quilted design to a jacket, please bring a new or used denim jacket, or any jacket you wish to decorate.

***This is a beginner class, however you need knowledge of your sewing machine including how to thread it, how to thread your bobbin, and how to sew a straight stitch.
